A particular effect during war is a greater appreciation of home. Experts say the natural response is to seek comfort in home, friends and family. Dr. Pepper Schwartz, a Washington University professor of psychology, says these effects are both psychological and physiological.

An interesting side effect is that while Americans always seek to maximize the comfort of their homes, home improvement businesses are still reporting boom, despite the recession.

Although recent developments in high-tech, synthetic fabrics offer nicely draping, buttery-soft fabrics, a return to simple comfort during stressful times also means a return to the pleasures of former times and production methods. This means that quilts and quilting are big now. Interior designer Patricia Wood of Harbor Springs combines "comfort, function and style" in her projects. Wood, who divides her time between northern Michigan and Dallas, offers "a fantasy of antique furniture upholstered in vintage quilts."

Stewart-Zacks emphasizes comfort goods for the home, but also offers a price range of fabrics which can be special ordered after making choices from the manufacturers' (Salamandre, Anna French, Schumacher, etc.) sample books at the store. Their in-store quilts fall into three ranges, \$124, \$250 and \$600-\$700.

Mary Zack said that Traverse cus-tomers are busy people: "They know what they want; they like custom goods and have good taste, but most don't have the time to sew or quilt. We are very busy offering these ser-vices to them."
