## Take home the prize literally — in annual Hole-in-One contest

Golfers should hone their skills in preparation for the National Cherry Festival's week-long Hole-In-One Golf Contest sponsored by Garland and Passageways/ Carlson Wagonlit Travel in cooperation with Sunny 101.9.

The eight-day event takes place July 5-12 at Traverse City's Bay Meadows Golf Course & Lee Houtteman Learning Center, located just two miles from downtown Traverse City on Barney Road.

Festival-goers will take their best shots at a hole-in-one on a specially designed and built golf hole, playing 79 yards through the final day of competition on Friday, July 11.

Each Festival day, a closest-to-the-pin winner will be declared (or several, if more than one hole-in-one is made) and asked to return for the final shoot-out slated for 2 p.m. Saturday, July 12, at Bay Meadows.

The final shoot-out will take place on a 170-yard hole located on the Par Three Golf Course at Bay Meadows. The first person to make a hole-inone in the final shoot-out will win a Golf Home at Garland Resort.

Sharon Peacock, director of the hole-in-one contest, said the house would be built for the winner.

The Garland Golf Home will be situated on the Fountains Golf Course. The grand prize is a Williamsburg, one-and-a-half-story, 2,192-square-foot home complemented by a large country kitchen and great room. There are three bedrooms, two-and-a-half baths and a large office, which opens into a dining room.

Guests are greeted by a 48foot covered front porch, complete with log railings, two dormers, a fireplace, skylight, Pella windows and six-panel solid pine doors. The home also features an attached twocar garage, four-inch well and hot water heat.

If none of the finalists succeed, the participant closest to the pin will win a trip for two to a premiere Las Vegas golf destination courtesy of Passageways Travel.

"The winner two years ago said it was a really fabulous vacation," Peacock said.

Daily hole-in-one winners will be able to enjoy a Garland Golf Getaway for two people. Each daily prize will feature a two-night stay.
