TCJGA begins season

More than 600 golfers take part

The Traverse City Junior Golf Association (TCJGA) is entering its 20th season of instruction and tournament play.

More than 600 juniors participated in 2002. Most of the players come from northwestern Michigan.

The association helps young golfers 5-over develop their game, learn etiquette and gain selfconfidence while playing and practicing on some of the finest golf courses in the state.
