Crystal Mountain will be the site of the Michigan Women's Open Pro-Am and Tournament.

The Fifth Third Bank Michigan Women's Open Tournament, presented by Detroit Newspapers, is a 54-hole, stroke play Michigan PGA event scheduled for July 14-16. It carries a \$25.000 minimum purse and is one of very few Women's Open events in the country. Any female amateur golfer who is a Michigan resident with an established handicap of 15 or less, or any female professional residing in the state of Michigan or a Michigan Section PGA Member in good standing is eligible to play in the

event Crystal's Golf Ambassador, former LPGA Tour player Elaine Crosby, has won the tournament the last two vears.

Prior to the championship, there is a two-day. 36-hole Michigan's Women's Open Pro Am, July 11-13. The format for the Pro-Am is a fiveperson scramble, where each foursome plays with a PGA or LPGA Professional

Prizes will be awarded in both women-only and mixed teams divisions

Fifth Third Bank is the title sponsor of the six-day event. In addition, for the first time in the Open's history, a beneficiary has been named, and a portion of the monies raised from both the pro-am and tournament will be donated to the Munson Healthcare Regional Foundation of northern Michigan, whose mission is to provide for the improvement of health of the people in the communities served by Munson Healthcare.
