Kingsley Club: The Kingsley Club, which opened two years ago, was built on high rolling countryside pastures. The club was committed to preserving the environment on this private course, designed by Traverse City's Mike DeVries. The par-71 course plays up to 6911 yards. Membership will be limited to 250. Located 12 miles south of Traverse City. Call 946-5538.

Lochenheath: Formerly a cherry orchard, Lochenheath offers vistas of East Bay on 16 of its 18 holes. Steve Smyers designed a par-71 course for players of all ability to enjoy. The course plays from 7,000 yards to just over 5,000. Lochenheath will allow a limited amount of daily-fee play initially. It will eventually be a private course. Located on U.S.-31, just north of Grand Traverse Resort and Spa. Call 938-9800.

Mitchell Creek Golf Course: Mitchell Creek's layout includes two rugged par-5 holes of 540 and 485 yards. The nine-hole course among the area's newest plays to 3,253-yards. Located at 2846 Three Mile Road, 1½ miles south of Munson Avenue in Traverse City. 941-5200.



pines. The course meanders in and out of hardwood forests, jack pine stands, sand dunes and finishes along side the beautiful 38-acre Lake AuSable.

embodies the best of both links-style courses and a typical northern Michigan course cut through hardwood forests," said GM Tom Fous.

"It's the first time I've been associated with a development that is geographically an island, but literally that is what we are. The 400,000-acre Huron National Forest surrounds us. It's a spectacular rustic, tranquil setting that will never be duplicated."

The course which measurers over

7,100 yards from the tournament tees gets down to a playable 5,100 yards from the forward tees. An unusual feature at Forest Dunes is the junior tees. Measuring a little over 3,300 yards from the kids' tees, it makes the course very playable for junior golfers. More golf courses should take note of this feature.

Forest Dunes features a number of fun strategic challenges including a 10,000-square-foot, crescentshaped green, a dual fairway for risk/reward opportunities, a 605-yard par-five, and a signature Weiskopf short par-four cut through native sand dunes.

If your match ends up tied after the 18th hole, than head to the 117yard, par-three 19th hole created for just such occurrences. The course also has a 15-acre practice facility that can handle just about any type shot you could imagine. It features a dual-ended range, undulating tee areas to practice different shots and your short game, as well as a twoacre putting course.

Fous wasn't sure how long the course would remain open to the public, but put Forest Dunes on your "must play" list and take advantage of the opportunity while it lasts. It truly is that spectacular.
