'Leelanau Portraits' inaugurates renovated museum

There is quite the bubble of excitement around the Leelanau Historic Museum these days.

First, the museum has undergone a slick renovation. Gone are the old floors and worn walls; in their places are beautiful hardwood floors and white walls boasting exhibits.

Second, and equally important to the excitement at the museum, is the current exhibit by artist Frederic Petroskey. Titled "Leelanau Portraits by Frederick Petroskey: The Artist and His Community," it's a collection of portraits of people from around Leelanau County. Petroskey used different techniques to create them, some having been oil on canvas creations, and others pastel on

collection the museum has assembled are well-known around the area, and some are just people who piqued Petroskey's interest.

"I look at them and I say, this person," said Petroskey, explaining how he selected his subjects.

Some exhibits on display at the museum are projects Petroskey was commissioned to produce; others are portraits he painted for himself.

Petroskey graduated from Western Michigan University in 1962, majoring in art. He had been painting in his free time, but was attending graduate school to be a journalist.

Then a self-directed question changed Petroskey's direction. He wondered, "If I had all of the money in the world, what would I do?" The answer was "paint." So Petroskey scrapped his

journalistic aspirations and enrolled in art classes, where he found plenty of success.

Petroskey spent 17 years teaching in Lincoln, 'This area would really miss Massachusetts. Meanwhile, he maintained a studio, too, where portraits were his best-sellers.



"Some of them I hadn't seen in 15 to 20 years," said Petroskey. "It comes as kind of a shock."
