Last season, Big North teams struggled mightily out of the league, compiling a 6-14 mark in non-conference action. Two of those six wins came from Cheboygan and the Sault, who each went 1-1. Gaylord had half of the league's non-league victories.

The loss of the pair takes away two teams that frequently lagged behind in the BNC because of having fewer students to draw upon for ath-

The result could be more pressure on teams in the bottom half of the conference.

"They'll do what they have to do to get better," TC West coach Matt Prisk said.

As the reigning league champ, everyone will be gunning for TRAVERSE CITY WEST.

"We have a target on our back," Prisk said. "I'm sure they'll be coming after us, and that's to be expected. If you run a good program, and win some games that's going to happen. That's a compliment."

The Titans have eight starters back on defense and seven on offense from a team that went undefeated in BNC play, racking up over 34 points per game while giving up only 10 a contest.

West lost its first two games in 2003, rebounding with seven consecutive wins. including close contests against fellow BNC powers Gaylord and TC Central.

TRAVERSE CITY CENTRAL will have a large turnover, returning six starters on defense and four on offense.

Despite a low number of returning starters, the Trojans are relatively experienced due to several sophomores starting on varsity last season. Just five of the team's 22 starters on offense and defense will be seniors this

winning streak after an 0-2 start to force a regular-season finale showdown with West for the league crown. The Trojans went on to lose the closely-contested game 29-21, but made the playoffs for the first time since 1991.

Defensive backs Eric Miller, Phil Dandy and George Wilson join linebacker Nick Respecki as returners on a defense that surrendered just 8.7 points a game in BNC play last season.

Coach William Cleaver says the team isn't as big as in recent seasons, but is possibly the fastest team he's had in his five years as head of the Blue Devil program.

Without Sault Ste. Marie around, Gaylord will be the only Blue Devils squad in the league for the first time since the Big North was formed in

Gaylord, whose only regularseason losses last season Central reeled off a six-game came to the two Traverse City programs, will play Cheboygan Sept. 3 in the two schools' first non-conference meeting since 1967. Both schools were in the nowdefunct Michigan Huron Shores Conference from 1968-1996.

Junior Matt McDonald started part of last season, throwing for 620 yards and five touchdowns and rushing for another 300 yards and a TD. He has junior split end Chazz Masten returning as a target.

On defense, three spots on the D-line return in junior end Nick Marinelli, junior tackle Craig Kennard and Hoekwater, a senior end. Kennard was a second-team all-Big North selection last season.

Kanitz, the team's leading returning tackler with 54 stops, and Ryan Heray are back at linebacker, while Masten will start again at cor-

"We're young, but quite a few played a lot because we had a bunch of kids up last year," Webb said.

The Vikings were 1-6 in the league last year (1-8 overall), with its lone win coming against Cheboygan.

PETOSKEY is coming off its first winning Big North season since a 17-3 streak in the first two seasons of the league in 1997-98, and a senior-laden team gives the squad hopes of improving on that mark.

Twenty-two seniors should returning starters for the Northmen.

Senior running back Matt Hewson ran for over 600 vards on his way to honorable mention all-conference honors. Senior linemen Joe Spuller and Bill White provide experienced blockers for Hewson and the double wing attack.

On defense, White was an all-conference inside linebacker last season and is joined by returning starter Dylan Burns at outside linebacker. Spuller and senior strong safety Scott Chellis also return in Petoskey's 50 front defense.

ALPENA was off to a 2-1 start last season — scoring 62 points twice in that span before a 29-28 loss to Petoskey kicked off a 1-4 tailspin.

"Alpena really started pretty strong last year," Petoskey coach Kerry Van Orman said. "They had some young players there, so they should only get better."
