Hungry for more

Gladiators hope to ride the wave of 2003 state title

TRAVERSE CITY — If there's any momentum left from last year, the Traverse City St. Francis Gladiators hope to ride it.

They just don't want to talk about it.

Nine months after the Gladiators beat Hudson 28-14 to win the 2003 Division 7 state football championship at the Pontiac Silverdome, St. Francis coaches and players believe they have the personnel to win another title.

As for last season, they'd like to put that up on the shelf, right along side their title trophy.

"We told these guys at the start of practice, 'Last year was a great year, and we'll have memories that last a lifetime. But that chapter is closed," " said St. Francis coach Josh Sellers, whose team set a school record by going 14-0 in his first season at the helm. "Last year's team won't play another game. It's done.

"We want this team to make its own mark and leave the past in the past."

Senior quarterback Joe Hastings said forgetting last season is difficult, but neces-

"Mentally, it's hard to put last year behind us because we expect so much so soon," he said. "You want to pick it up right where you left off.

"People are going to ask, 'Was it a fluke?' But you can't get caught up in that or it'll eat you alive.

"It becomes a mental game," he said. "We're a different team. This is 2004, not 2003. You have to look forward."

Senior offensive back/linebacker Sam Schilling, who scored two touchdowns in the championship game last

November, said the Gladiators the state." have to use last year's title run as a way to elevate their performance this fall.

"We have the talent, and we definitely have the experience," he said. "Everyone knows what it takes to reach that next level.

"(Winning last year) puts more pressure on the team, but I don't think much about it. I just focus on the present."

That's good news for Sellers, who refuses to compare last year's team to this one. His words on the subject are mea-

Asked if St. Francis can win another title, which would be the fourth in school history, Sellers nodded.

"The answer is, 'Yes, we can," he said, then added, "We have just as good a

chance as every other team in

The Gladiators return only five starters from last fall, but those five players filled nearly half of the 22 positions.

Hastings (6-foot-3, 190 pounds) is the only one of the five who plays exclusively on offense, but Sellers believes the importance of his position adds weight.

"Because he's the quarterback, you can argue that he's the biggest key," Sellers said. "He's the general, the most vocal of the returnees.

"And he's worked hard this summer. He went to several camps to make himself better."

Hastings believes those camps will pay dividends, but he said nothing that he's done is more valuable than the
