## Elmbrook turns 40 Area course caters to local golfers

The modern era of golf in the

Traverse City area could easily be linked — no pun intended — to the start of Elmbrook Golf Course in 1964 when it incorporated.

Celebrating its 40th year in business, Elmbrook still likes to consider itself "Traverse City's golf

course," according to one of the second generation owners Carolyn Olson, whose dad Vern Nelson started the business and laid out the original course.

"We've always catered to the local golfers," Olson proudly pointed out. "We still operate 17 local leagues, which is a lot. The Elmbrook men's and women's leagues, which have been in existence for over 30 years, are the

oldest continually operating

leagues in the area." Over the years Elmbrook has also hosted numerous charitable events, and been very supportive of junior golf and school programs. This season the course will premier new junior forward tees on all 18 holes. It's the first area

golf course to specifically offer such tees. "My father always believed in supporting the junior golf programs," added Olson. "He knew they were the future of the sport,

and it's a tradition that we proud-

nized that the natural contours of the old Sledder family farm would make a wonderful golf course. He

laid out the course and construction began in 1964. The spring of 1966 the first nine holes opened

with a little fanfare as then Lt. Gov. William G. Milliken teed off the first ball.

It became the area's first 18hole layout five years later when the second nine was opened in 1969, according to Olson.

Over the years the course has been tweaked here and there, but the original layout has remained

pretty much intact. "I think he was proudest of the Great Lakes sand trap that was added in the 1980s on the par five third hole," she added. "When you stand on that tee and look out on the Great Lakes-shaped

sand trap, it's pretty impressive."

Olson, who feels that the sixth

hole is Elmbrook's signature hole, said that well known golf course architect Jerry Mathews helped her dad design that hole. The sixth hole tees off from the

long par-four — over 400 yards from the back tees — plays into a naturally contoured valley to an elevated green. From the tee box you get distant views of both bays and Old Mission Peninsula. Her favorite hole is the tree-

lined, dog-leg, par-five 13th hole. "It's just a beautiful, graceful

hole with trees lining both sides of

the fairway," she said. "The hole is well defined and somewhat isolated." Elmbrook is a golf course only,

which has some advantages. They don't have to worry about a mint on the pillow for their hotel guests. All of their efforts are directed at providing the best product they can to the golfing public; a feat they have been accomplishing for the last 40 years. In celebration of that 40 years in

business, Elmbrook is offering free golf to players on their birthdays this season. If your birthday is in the middle of winter you still get half-price golf on the corresponding six-month date. For more details, call (231) 946-9180. Elmbrook is also hosting the sec-

ond installment of the Haig Hickory Tournament on June 18. A benefit for the Grand Traverse Heritage Center last year in its inaugural year, they hope it becomes an annual event. Limited team openings remain for the event, but the field was filling rapidly at press time. Only the old fashioned hickory clubs, which Elmbrook furnishes, are permitted for play.
