for Memorial Day 2005.

"The water park is a tremendous addition to the existing seasonal activities," said Julie Ard, Boyne spokesperson.

Boyne is building the park to complement its other recreational activities, including golf in the summer and skiing in the winter.

Lodging and dining, in addition to Boyne's existing attractions, will make Avalanche Bay "truly a destination water play area," Ard said.

While families wait for these new areas to open, two existing locations cater to indoor and outdoor water park experiences.

Bear Track Landing, currently Michigan's premier indoor water park, is part of Great Wolf Lodge in Traverse City. The indoor park offers waterslides, hot tubs, a lazy river and Fort MacKenzie, a 12 -story tree fort.

At 38,000 square feet, Bear Track Landing will be surpassed in size by Avalanche Bay at Boyne.

"We knew that it was inevitable that we would see competition sprout up," said Rex O'Connor, director of sales and marketing. "Being the first in the market, we actually have created the benchmark on which our competitors measure against."

O'Connor said Great Wolf holds an advantage over other water parks because it offers many amenities, such as food and entertainment, in one place.

To get outdoor water entertainment, families can venture to Fun Country in Interlochen. Operating for more than 20 years, the water park offers waterslides along with mini-golf and go-carts.

Even with the pending addition of Thunder Falls and The Park at Water's Edge, owner Randy Mahoney believes Fun Country offers a different environment.

"We still think we offer a unique product," he said. "We're trying to improve the park every year."


Fun Country caters mostly to families with both water and land activities.

While all the parks will be appealing to summer water seekers, each offers something different to the market, which may benefit everyone, O'Connor said.

"Anybody who is going to be marketing to people downstate or outside of the state is probably going to help everyone who has a water park."
