While the "clueless actors" act out the scene, it is their job to guess what the audience knows.

Since the audience plays a key role in each of the games, none of the shows

are ever the same, Avis said.

The show's format will remain relatively similar to past years, but In Jest Seconds has come up with new additions to its performances.

"This year we'll be throwing in short pre-written sketches we write dur-

ing rehearsals and we're excited about trying them out," Avis said. "The majority of the show will always be improvised because that's what we love doing."

sation," he said.

Also new this year are three cast members — Micki Davis, Matt Harting and Ashleigh Hanchett. Returning cast members Michael Gauthier, Avis and Sato will round out the lineup.
