Expanded hours and space for boat show

Show and sale runs April 23 - May 1

The Northern Michigan Boat Show and Sale comes back to Traverse City with an expanded schedule and a new location.

Previously a winter event, the Show and Sale has been moved from an indoor resort location to the Grand Traverse Civic Center's Howe Arena, allowing for both indoor and outdoor displays. Local dealers will feature a variety of boats in different styles, as well as boat lifts, docks, accessories and ser-

vice information.

Included in the show will be fiberglass, fishing and pontoon boats, according to Liz Carney of Grand Bay Marine, a key dealer in the event. Also, for the first time the Boat Show and Sale will feature electric-powered watercraft, presented by Johnson Outdoors.

"They're an option for people interested in the environment," Carney said, "and could be a solution on lakes that don't allow gas-powered boats."

A portion of the proceeds from each night will be donated to the Goodwill Inn's ject, which will double the new homeless shelter pro-



Inn's capacity and provide shelter to homeless youth. Organizers for the capital fundraising project welcome the contribution.

"When people want to partner with us, that's great," said Ruth Blick, a member of the Inn's Capital Campaign Committee. "We appreciate them bringing us into the fold and making a difference in the community.'

Extra outdoor space will be a key component this year, attractive to dealer and shopper alike.

"There's much more display area (in the Civic Center) and it's been a good venue for other shows," Carney said.

For starters, exhibitors won't be limited to brochures and smaller models. With two handle four and five-thoularge dock dealers on hand,
