### **2. GRAYLING**

Coach: Ben Brock 2004: 6-1 in LMC, 8-2 overall

Key Players Returning: WR Eli Van Nuck (5-9, 165 Sr.), QB Bobby Starks (6-2, 210 Sr.), RB Joey Bancroft (5-9, 185 Sr.), DB/WR Zac Baker (5-11, 185 Sr.), DL/OL Matt Larson (6-2, 270 Sr.)

**Top Newcomers:** DB/WR Jeff Bancroft (Jr.)

**Outlook:** The Vikings are looking for more after last year's breakout season grabbed the attention of the community — and the Lake Michigan Conference — and ended in the Division 5 playoffs. There's plenty to be excited about again, with the return of three talented skill players — Van Nuck, Starks and Bancroft — all of whom were mentioned by league coaches as players to watch this season.

Van Nuck hauled in 35 passes for 700-plus yards and 15 touchdowns. Starks passed for 1,400 yards and 17 scores. And Bancroft rambled for 1,230 yards and 15 TDs. All three earned all-conference honors.

Starks will have to work behind an inexperienced line — the Vikings lost four of their five starting linemen — which Brock believes will increase Grayling's air time.

"We're looking to throw a lot," he said. "We'll have to."

Brock believes his team will be joined by Boyne City, Charlevoix and East Jordan in chasing St. Francis.

"We go out there to win every game," Brock said. "We'll try to dethrone (the Gladiators), but they're going to be tough. They have such a good program."

change this fall, when Boyne returns Brown and Ameel in the backfield and four starters on the line.

"It's always a good feeling going into the season with some knowns on both sides," Hills said.

Looking to the league race, Hills sees St. Francis and Grayling as the favorites, but likes the overall quality of the conference, which for the first time in years did not see any turnover in the coaching ranks.

"It's similar to last year in that there's balance to it," Hills said. "The top four or five teams are relatively close, and the whole league is improving overall.

"I think coaching stability has a lot to do with it. Programs are starting to establish themselves."

## **4. CHARLEVOIX**

Coach: Don Jess 2004: 5-2 in LMC, 5-4 overall Key Players Returning: LB/OT Jeff Golovich (6-3, 200 Sr.), WR/SS Eddie Waldron (6-3, 190 Sr.), RB/DE Russell Williams (5-10, 175) Sr.), C/NG Ray Jones (5-10, 240 Jr.)

**Top Newcomers:** QB/FS Matt Kantz (Jr.), WR Matt Kline (Jr.), CB Cliff Jones (Soph.), RB/OLB Kyle Jones (Soph.)

**Outlook:** Despite a 5-2 record in the league, good enough for third place, the Rayders failed to make the play-offs last season after losing their two non-conference games.

If that is going to change this fall, Golovich will have plenty to say about it. The two-year captain is entering his third season as a starting linebacker. He has 150 career tackles.

Offensively, Kantz has a couple of solid threats at his disposal. Waldron had 25 receptions a year ago, and Williams rushed for 600 yards. Both will have to turn it up a notch for Charlevoix to reach the playoffs. Jones, the strongest player on the team, anchors the line.

### **5. EAST JORDAN**

Top Newcomers: TB David Marr (6-0, 170 Jr.)

**Outlook:** Looking for a dark horse in the Lake Michigan Conference? This could be the team. One league coach pointed to the strides that Ernst has made in his first two seasons at East Jordan and predicted that the Red Devils would become a factor in the league race this fall.

Ernst isn't ready to go out on a limb, but he likes what he sees.

"We have a senior-dominated group, and when this team was together on JV they were 6-1 before I pulled up the quarterback and fullback," he said. "They've been successful. They hope for it and expect it."

Newcomer Marr ran for 1,400 yards on junior varsity last year and could carry the rushing load this season.

"We're experienced, but we're not big," Ernst said. "It will all come down to how well we open holes and protect the quarterback."

#### 6. ELK RAPIDS

**Coach:** Josh Merchant **2004:** 2-5 in LMC, 4-5 overall

**Top Newcomers:** HB/DB Cory William (6-0, 170 Sr.), SE/DE Nathan Yankee (6-2, 190 Sr.), G/LB Brandon Isenhart (5-9, 165 Jr.)

**Outlook:** Merchant, entering his third season as head coach, has breathed life into the Elks' program. When he took over, Elk Rapids had 17 players — that's varsity and JV combined — and two Pop Warner youth teams. This fall, the varsity and JV squads each have 30 players and Pop Warner is so popular in Elk Rapids that the town has five teams to accommodate everyone.

"Expectations are rising," Merchant said. "Our four wins last year equaled our total since 2000.

"Our numbers are way up, and that's exciting."

**Outlook:** Taylor enters his 20th season as the Blazers' head coach with

one main goal — to be competitive.

"I think we can," Taylor said. "The first half of our schedule is pretty tough. We play non-conference games at Pine River and Roscommon, open the league at home against Harbor (Springs) then play at St. Francis and home against Grayling.

"If can get through that stretch healthy, I think we can finish strong."

Taylor has a number of returnees, plus he said his team's overall numbers and size are both up.

"We have eight or nine guys over 200 pounds," Taylor said. "By our standards, that's huge."

### **8. HARBOR SPRINGS**

**Top Newcomers:** HB Josh Vandermus (6-0, 180 Jr.), C Ron Shock (6-0, 295 Jr.)

**Outlook:** Times have been tough for Harbor Springs, but Jess hopes the football program may finally be turning.

"The program is really down. What I'm looking for is improvement," Jess said. "I'd like to see us be competitive.

"We're going to have to win some games to increase participation. Sure, it's fun to play, but you have to win to keep kids involved."

Foster has moved from tight end to tackle to help shore up the Rams' offensive line, but Harbor Springs' lack of experience — only three returning seniors — may be tough to overcome.

Shock will be a nice addition because of his size and agility. Twiss, who is in his 31st year of coaching (second at Harbor), calls Shock "the best big kid I've ever coached."

"His overall athleticism is better than most kids that size," Twiss said.
