"Our goal is to heal, enhance, and uplift peoples' lives through the use of high quality aromatherapy products," Mike said. "Our hand poured candles, made with the finest essential and fragrance oils, are designed to promote health and well being."

You won't find traditional holiday candles at Ravenwood; the products here are meant to be much more than decorative.
