Art for the sake of a great gift

One the most beautiful and often overlooked gifts is the gift of art. Choices might be a soothing watercolor landscape, a bright modern ceramic bowl or a large, glass sculpture that dazzles when light hits it.

Holiday shoppers are fortunate in the number of art galleries in northern Michigan. They're in the small towns surrounding Traverse City, and a number of them are right on Front Street.

Most galleries have a focus, a mission or a specialty, and that can be helpful to the shopper, since it saves time and it helps shoppers to make the selection.

While Mullaly's 128 in downtown Elk Rapids has gifts that range from stocking stuffers like pen knives and money clips to fine art and wood carvings, the gallery specializes in glass, and that includes museum quality glass sculpture.

Owner Barbara Mullaly represents the work of more than 300 artists — 150 glass artists alone — and she has met every one of them in person.

"My job is to give the customer as much in formation about the artist and his work as is possible," Mullaly said.

Shopping at the gallery while she talks about its pieces is like listening to a museum docent. The information is helpful, and it is also an art education.

Mullaly says that she doesn't know if people are more knowledgeable about art today, but in the case of blown glass, she does know that they are certainly more exposed to it.

Color and light dazzles in fused and blown glass. Mullaly points out a blown glass sculptural piece that glistens with colors from light blue to pale orange, a collection of perfume bottles, a large and elegant piece — suitable for a dining room table, black in a gold leaf stand.

"We have everything for a modern home," she said. "There are some wonderfully contemporary sculptural glass artists."

A small elongated lipped bowl in teal and rose colors and a unique glass jellyfish are examples.

Thayer are new to the Traverse gallery scene, having recently purchased Evergreen Gallery on Front Street in Traverse City.

Their goal, says Cathleen Thayer, is "to be a support to local artists and craftsmen in the area, as well as to be a place where quality art and craft can be found, works that are functional and inspiring."

Evergreen offers works in a range of prices so that a child on an allowance might purchase an art card to stand on his teacher's desk, a couple might choose an watercolor landscape for the home, and a young professional might select an upscale piece for the office.

"We want families of all income levels to find something for their homes or for gifts," Thayer said.

She noted that everything in the gallery is handcrafted in American and much of it made locally.

The Wooden Gallery, also on Front Street, features art and documents preserved by a unique process. They work with photos, lithographs, canvases, posters, newspaper articles, prints, children's artwork and more. The works are first saturated in a special acrylic formula and then finished by brushing by hand. Thus preserved, they need no glass and have the great advantages of being unbreakable and also non-

reflective.
The subjects of the gallery's art are varied.
There might be European street scenes or floral print; they might capture a scene of firemen. A preserved family photo or document certainly makes a caring personal gift.
