ally three to nine months before the wedding, and then touch base again a week or so before the wedding," Walker said.

She described one of the most challenging choices a couple has to make regarding wedding photography is whether they will be photographed together before the ceremony.

Some brides want to be first seen in their gowns walking down the aisle, but waiting until the actual wedding can lead to couples feeling rushed through the obligatory posed wedding portraits.

Walker photographs about 20 weddings each year and an associate photographer joins her for these occasions, so coverage is extensive.

"Having two photographers at every wedding provides extra coverage for multiple angles, capturing the action and the reaction as well as providing backup for those critical once-in-a-lifetime moments," Walker said.

For the wedding couple, Walker has the capability to use digital technology and create a story-telling album that is four-color offset printed, a coffee table book containing 400 or more images.

In the end, Walker described her ultimate accomplishment: "I know that through my photos, couples will remember how they felt, not just how they looked."
