## Geneva Winterfest is fun for the whole family

GENEVA — David Gale and Andrew White are hoping for a few snowflakes for the annual Winterfest weekend, hoping the forecast lands somewhere between 50 degree weather and the polar vortex.

The erratic weather pat-

terns are an emotional roller coaster, Gale said, as organizers try to plan for the annual Geneva Winterfest celebration.

Winterfest 2014 will be held Feb. 1 in the Geneva area. All events are free.

"As always, our biggest challenge is the weather," Gale said. "You worry about a lack of snow for a winter festival, but if it snows too much then you have to move it and plow

Winterfest will kick off at with an all-you-can-eat pancake breakfast at the United Methodist Church on South Broadway from 9 a.m. until

Cost is \$5 for adults and \$3 for children for the breakfast. To-go orders will be available.

The Winterfest parade will begin at noon on North and South Broadway and will include floats, fire trucks, marching bands, and the Winterfest mascot, Lake Effect Louie.

The Geneva Fire Department will host a fire extinguisher simulator demonstration, fire station tours, free Dunkin Donut Munchkins and hot cocoa and coffee and warming stations at the fire station on North Forest Street.

The famous chili cook-off. presented by the Geneva Area Chamber of Commerce, will be held in the Depot Road lot behind Griffith's Furniture. The lot is also the pick up and drop

off point for free horse-drawn wagon rides through the city.

The chili cook-off will be located in tents behind Griffith's Furniture.

"We do what we can to keep our chilly chili cooks as warm as possible as they serve up cup after cup of chili," said cook off organizer and Geneva Area Chamber of Commerce executive director Sue Ellen Foote.

All chili samples are free and tasters can make their selection for the coveted Taster's Choice award for the best chili in Geneva.

"Everyone wants their chili recipe to take the top prize," Foote said. "They are serious about those bragging rights!"

The Geneva Veterans of Foreign Wars post on Depot Street will host a spaghetti dinner from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Cost is \$6 per person and tickets will be sold at the door. The Community Improvement Corp. will host hot dogs and popcorn at the Geneva Community Center, where a bake sale and vendors will be set up. Ronald McDonald and Jungle Terry will also perform at the community center, with Ronald McDonald taking the stage at 2 p.m. and Jungle Terry and his happy menagerie performing at 3 p.m.

An inflatable fun land will be set up at the Geneva Recreation Center from 12:20 p.m. to 4

The Old Mill Winery on South Broadway will host a wine tasting and entertainment from 12:30 p.m. to 4 p.m. Wine is 50 cents per taste and the kitchen will be open and taking orders.

White said the area's premiere winter festival will have something for everyone.

"Of course we will have the chili cook-off and the parade and the horse-drawn sleds will be a part of Winterfest," he said. "But we will also have an indoor inflatable park at the Geneva Recreation Center and face painting."

Shuttle transportation to the village will be provided by Premier Transportation. Trolley rides will be given in the downtown area and will stop at the Old Mill Winery for the wine tasting.

The city ice skating rink will be open and free to everyone, if the weather cooperates.

"Unfortunately, there is no other way to freeze the ice in the rink other than just plain old natural cold weather, Geneva Assistant City Manager Jennifer Brown said.

If temperatures fall and the rink next to the Geneva Recreation Center is open, skate rentals will be available on site.

The Erie Brass Ensemble will take the stage at 1 p.m. at the United Church on South Broadway for a free concert.


